



Legislative Session Update

On January 2, 2023, the Montana Legislature began its 68th Legislative Session. Elected leaders from all corners of the state have begun the important work of balancing our state budget, weighing the merits of policy, and creating new laws to protect our way of life.

The Government Affairs team at the Montana Family Foundation has been at the capitol every day working to defend Judeo-Christian values over the course of the session. We ask that you--both personally and as a church body--pray for our elected leaders. This session, legislators will consider proposals to defend the sanctity of life, protect children from experimental "gender" transition surgeries, and ensure that doctors and healthcare providers are not forced to perform procedures that violate their conscience or deeply held beliefs.
