Explanation of Information

Montana Family Foundation believes elected officials should support policies and programs that protect and promote families, and traditional family values. To accomplish this goal, Montana Family Foundation educates the public about legislation and voting records. Legislators scoring 100% are considered outstanding family advocates.

1 House Bill 121

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Ensures privacy and safety in multi-occupancy restrooms, changing rooms, and sleeping quarters by requiring these spaces to be designated exclusively for males or females based on biological sex.

House Bill 300

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor Prohibits biological males from participating in female athletic programs and requires educational institutions to provide sex-segregated facilities such as restrooms, locker rooms, and sleeping quarters based on biological sex.

House Bill 388

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Prohibits state and local governments from imposing regulations on faith-based pregnancy centers based on their refusal to perform, refer, or counsel in favor of abortion.

House Bill 400

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Prohibits public schools and state institutions from penalizing students or employees for refusing to use non-biological gender pronouns or compelled speech and allows individuals to file lawsuits for monetary damages and injunctive relief if their rights are violated.

House Bill 557

Status: Failed 3rd Reading (Senate) did not pass Limits use of state-funded professional development days for teachers by prohibiting attendance at politically affiliated or divisive meetings of teacher organizations and ensuring that training is strictly focused on improving instructional quality.

655 House Bill 655

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Prohibits state government discrimination against adoption and foster care providers based on their religious beliefs.

House Bill 682

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Allows individuals to bring a private right of action in lawsuits related to gender transition treatments performed when they were minors.

R House Bill 723

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Requires medical facilities to report annually on infants born alive following an abortion or attempted abortion.

Senate Bill 114

Status: Missed Deadline for Transmittal

Mandates the display of the Ten Commandments in all public-school classrooms and buildings, emphasizing their historical and cultural significance.

Senate Bill 136

Status: Failed Second Reading (Senate)
Establishes that a patient's consent to physicianassisted suicide cannot be used as a legal
defense for a charge of homicide against the

physician involved.

Senate Bill 154

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor Prohibits the sale or purchase of human body parts under the Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift

parts under the Revised Uniform Anatomical Giff Act by explicitly banning the sale or purchase of whole human bodies or fetal tissue.

Senate Bill 218

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Establishes a private right of action for individuals who experience physical, psychological, emotional, or physiological injuries resulting from gender transition procedures.

Senate Bill 299

Status: Tabled in Committee (House)

Ensures parents have the right to access school information about their children and consent to instruction on sensitive topics.

Senate Bill 437

Status: Passed by the House and Senate
Defines "sex", "male", and "female" in Montana law
based on biological characteristics at birth.

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor
Allows individuals to bring a private right of action

in lawsuits related to gender transition treatments performed when they were minors.

House Bill 723

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor Requires medical facilities to report annually

on infants born alive following an abortion or attempted abortion.

Senate Bill 136

Status: Failed Second Reading (Senate)

Establishes that a patient's consent to physicianassisted suicide cannot be used as a legal defense for a charge of homicide against the physician involved.

Senate Bill 154

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor

Prohibits the sale or purchase of human body parts under the Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act by explicitly banning the sale or purchase of whole human bodies or fetal tissue.

Senate Bill 164 Status: Failed Second Reading (House)

Revises Montana's laws on endangering the welfare of children to explicitly prohibit medical treatments aimed at altering a child's biological sex or affirming a gender identity inconsistent with their biological sex for children under 16.

Senate Bill 218

Status: Passed, Signed by Governor Establishes a private right of action for individuals

who experience physical, psychological, emotional, or physiological injuries resulting from gender transition procedures.

Senate Bill 437

Status: Passed by the House and Senate Defines "sex", "male", and "female" in Montana law based on biological characteristics at birth.

Senate Bill 474

Status: Blast Motion Failed (House) Requires acceptance of religious and personal

medical exemptions for immunizations.
